## Web systems standards update

---

The Attorney General recently signed a final rule under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) recognizing the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 standard.

VITA's Web System Standard is based in part on WCAG 2.0. With the ADA Title II update, VITA is updating our standard as well.

Head to the online review and comment application (ORCA) (<https://orca.vita.virginia.gov/>) to review the updates and leave any comments or feedback. The public comment period will run through **Tuesday, May 28**.

There are a handful of rules that were added or updated to reflect WCAG 2.1, and your feedback is appreciated as always!

## eGov contracts

As a reminder, Manny Liban, our eGov service manager, has amended our contracts with AISN and SiteVision. Their service options now include

web remediation pricing available to agencies not currently hosted or serviced by the vendors.
