<p>SB 1002 / HB 1911: Amends §§ <del>2.2-3103.1</del> and <del>30-103.1</del> of the <i>Code of Virginia</i>; Prohibits officers and employees of state and local governments from receiving a gift with a value exceeding \$100 for which the fair market value or a gift of greater or equal value has not been provided or exchanged from foreign countries of concern</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>BUY-IT Chapter 5: section 5.3.1 Contributions and gifts prohibited during PPEA or PPTA approval process, to include amendments regarding prohibitions on certain gifts.</li> </ul>
<p>SB 1459: Amends § <del>2.2-2009</del> of the <i>Code of Virginia</i>; Prohibits any employee or agent of any executive branch agency or person or entity contracting with any such agency from downloading or using any application, including TikTok or WeChat, or accessing any website developed by ByteDance Ltd. or Tencent Holdings Ltd., on any state-issued device or state-owned or state-leased equipment.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Core Terms and Conditions: Added language to Statutorily Mandated Terms and Conditions, Prohibited Transactions, to include prohibitions on downloading and/or accessing applications or websites developed by the companies listed in the bill.</li> </ul>
<p>HB 1895: Amends § <del>40.1-28.01</del> of the Code of Virginia; Provides that no employer may require an employee or prospective employee to execute or renew any provision in a nondisclosure or confidentiality agreement, including any provision regarding nondisparagement, that has the purpose or effect of concealing the details of a sexual harassment claim.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Core Contractual Terms and Conditions: Added language to the Statutorily Mandated Terms and Conditions, Sexual Harassment: Training and Compliance to include language prohibiting an employer from requiring an employee or prospective employee to sign or renew a nondisclosure or confidentiality agreement with intent to conceal a sexual harassment claim.</li> </ul>
<p>N/A</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Small Purchase Policy: Adding Section VI detailing executive branch agencies' authority to request Quick Quotes for small purchases up to \$10,000; adding language clarifying circumstances under which an executive branch can request an exemption from Micro and SWaM-certified business set-aside requirements.</li> </ul>
