# FY 17 PSAP Grant Guidelines





## Overarching Changes

- The focus of the PSAP Grant program has been expanded from wireless 9-1-1 to NG9-1-1 and E-911
- Wireless 9-1-1 equipment and services has been changed to NG9-1-1 and E-911 equipment and services.
- Continuity and Consolidation and Enhancement Programs have been replaced with Shared Services and Individual PSAP Programs



## Overarching Changes

- Wireless Education Program is now the PSAP Education Program (PEP)
- The description and definition of “Regional Initiative” has been removed, as well as all references
- The term “CPE” has been replaced with “Call Handling Equipment”



## Multi-Jurisdictional Projects Definition

- A project in which two or more primary PSAPs participate. For the purpose of these grant guidelines, these are shared services, physical consolidations, and multi-jurisdictional PSAP Education Program (PEP) projects. PSAPs participating in these types of projects do not need to be contiguous.



## NG9-1-1 Ready Definition

- Call handling equipment with the ability to receive SIP communications natively at the call handling interface



## Recurring Costs Definition

- Periodic costs beyond the initial purchase of 9-1-1 equipment and/or services. With the purchase of 9-1-1 equipment and services, five years of prepaid service is allowable, but the period of cost recovery is limited to the grant award period. Allowable costs are limited to the projects that are identified in the Shared Services and Individual PSAP priority lists in the grant guidelines.



## Shared Services Program

- Shared Services projects are eligible for up to \$175,000 in funding for each participating PSAP
- There is no limit on the number of PSAPs that can participate in a multi-jurisdictional project
- The grant award amount for this type of project is based on the number of participating PSAPs



## Shared Services Program

- The priorities for shared services projects are as follows:
  - Call handling equipment
  - 9-1-1 mapping display systems
  - NG9-1-1 GIS equipment and services
  - Call accounting equipment/MIS
  - Physical consolidations & feasibility studies
  - CAD
  - Recorders and logging systems
  - Text-to-9-1-1



## Individual PSAP Program

- Maximum funding amount to remain at \$150,000
- Priorities limited to those currently identified within the Continuity and Consolidation Program and practical for an individual PSAP to undertake
- PSAP Group Training to be addressed within the PSAP Education Program



## Individual PSAP Program

- The priorities for individual PSAP projects are as follows:
  - Call handling equipment
  - 9-1-1 mapping display systems
  - NG9-1-1 GIS equipment and services
  - Call accounting equipment/MIS
  - CAD
  - Recorders and logging systems
  - Text-to-9-1-1



## PSAP Education Program

- PSAPs would have two funding options per a twelve month cycle:
  - One, a primary PSAP may receive up to \$2,000 to use towards allowable individual 9-1-1 and GIS specific group education/training opportunities
  - And two, a primary PSAP may receive up to \$3,000 to use towards multi-jurisdictional 9-1-1 and GIS specific group education/training opportunities



## GIS Matrix

- The GIS Matrix has been modified to include only the GIS High category
- The GIS Medium and Low categories have been removed, as well as the 9-1-1 Mapping Display column
- Items that remain in the GIS Matrix are for data production (enterprise software/hardware, GIS tools, data format conversion and manipulation) and data transfer



## GIS Matrix

- The focus of this priority is NG9-1-1 data production
- Data production and data transfer projects would be eligible for funding under the NG9-1-1 GIS Equipment and Services priority
- 9-1-1 Mapping Display projects would be eligible for funding under the 9-1-1 Mapping System priority



## Rankings

- Ranking integrates the established tiers and the priorities for the Shared Services and Individual PSAP Programs
  - Within each priority, the Shared Services grant type is ranked higher than the Individual PSAP grant type
- Text-to-9-1-1 is included in the ranking without a tier:
  - Shared services project (Priority 25)
  - Individual PSAP project (Priority 40)



## Other Proposed Changes

- Consistent deadlines
- Process change
- Clarification on consolidations
- Grant extension request period
- Budget Narrative includes recurring costs
- Clarifying language in Amounts Available and Multi-Year Funding sections

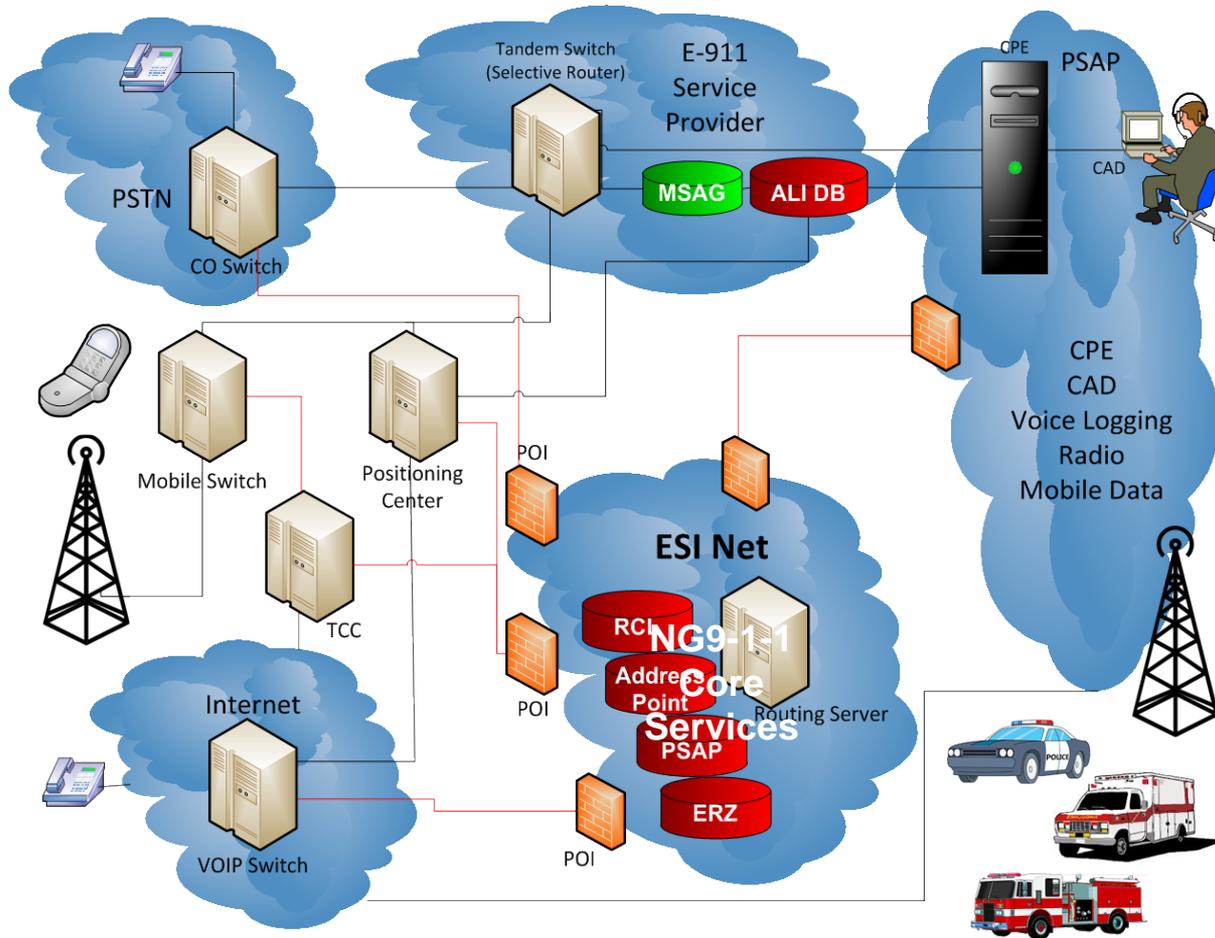




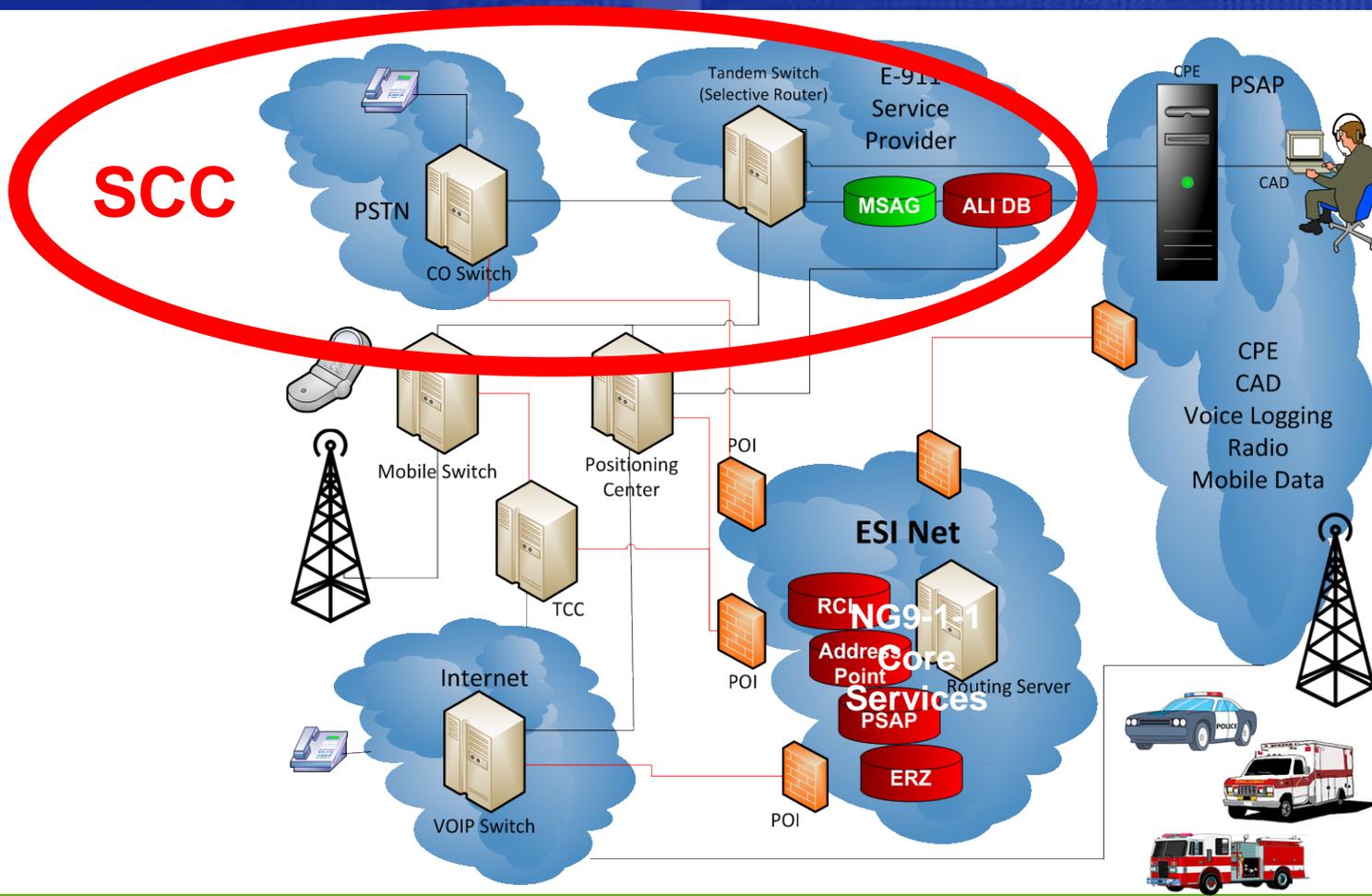
## NG-911 Governance/Legislative

- Address in first year:
  - Develop educational material for decision makers
  - Establish responsibility for the E-911 Board and supporting staff
  - Preserve and codify 9-1-1 as a locally managed, essential, public safety service
- Primarily assigned to Policy Committee
- Meetings March 26<sup>th</sup> and April 28<sup>th</sup>
- Goal to have legislation drafted by August 1

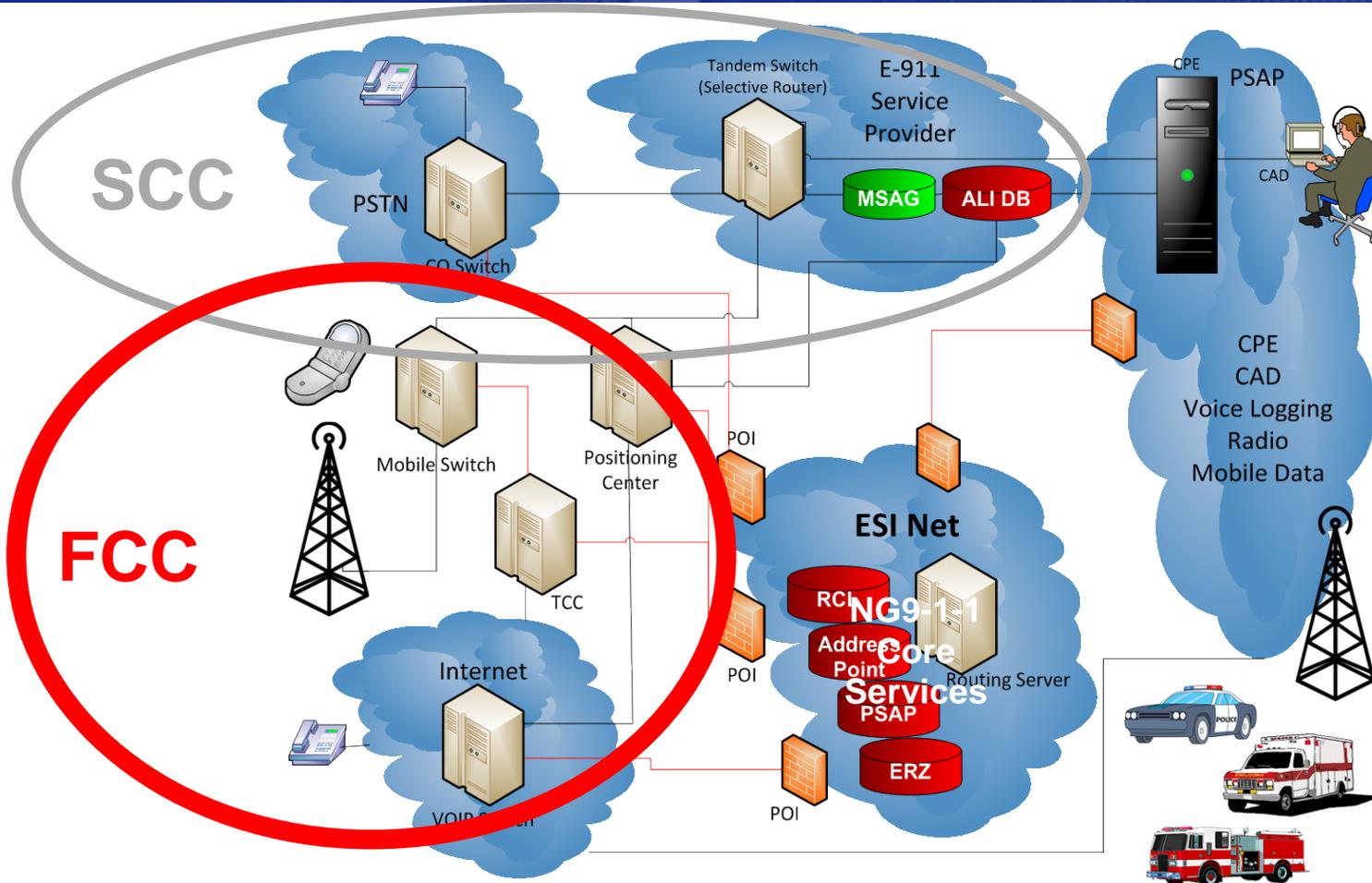

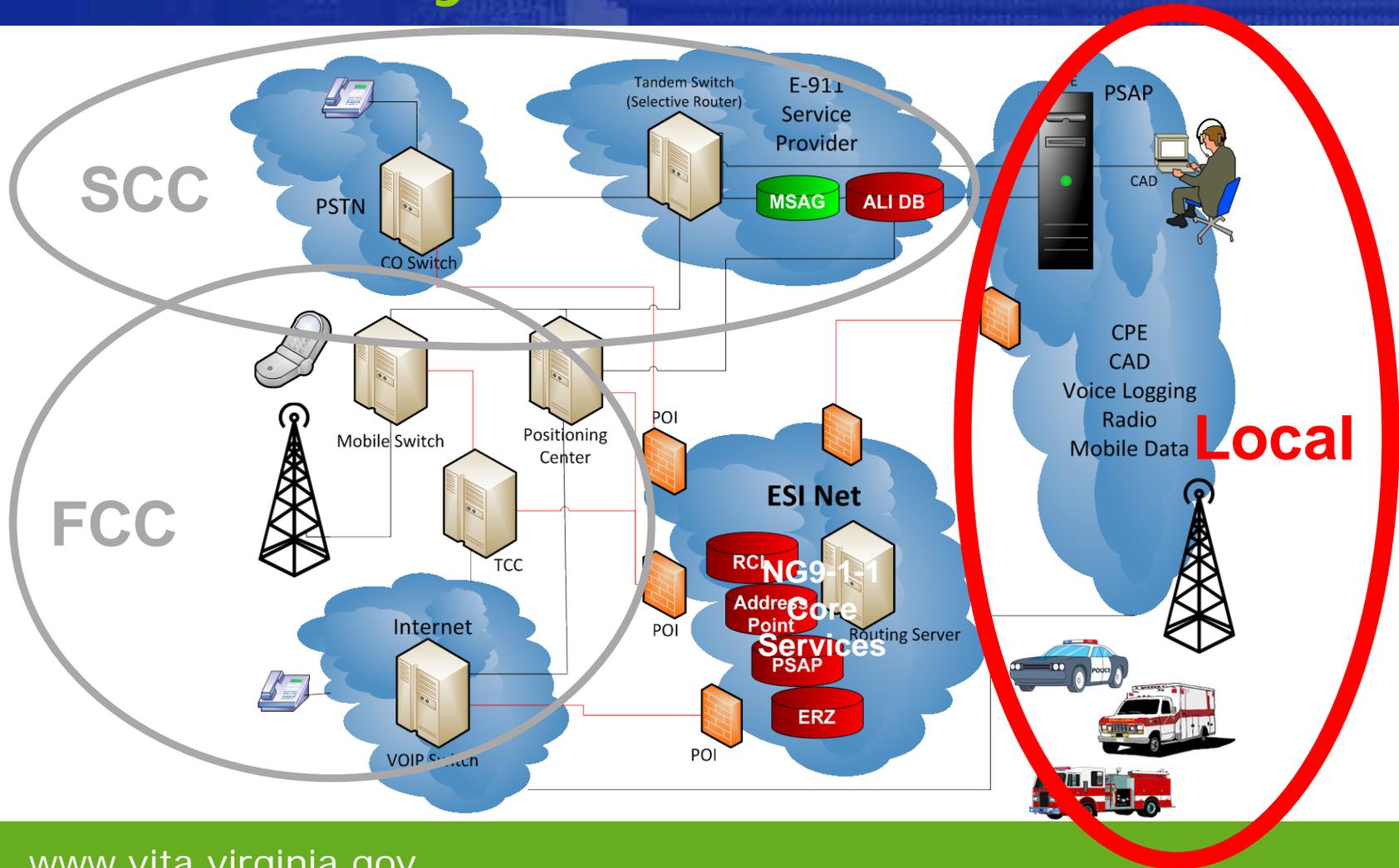

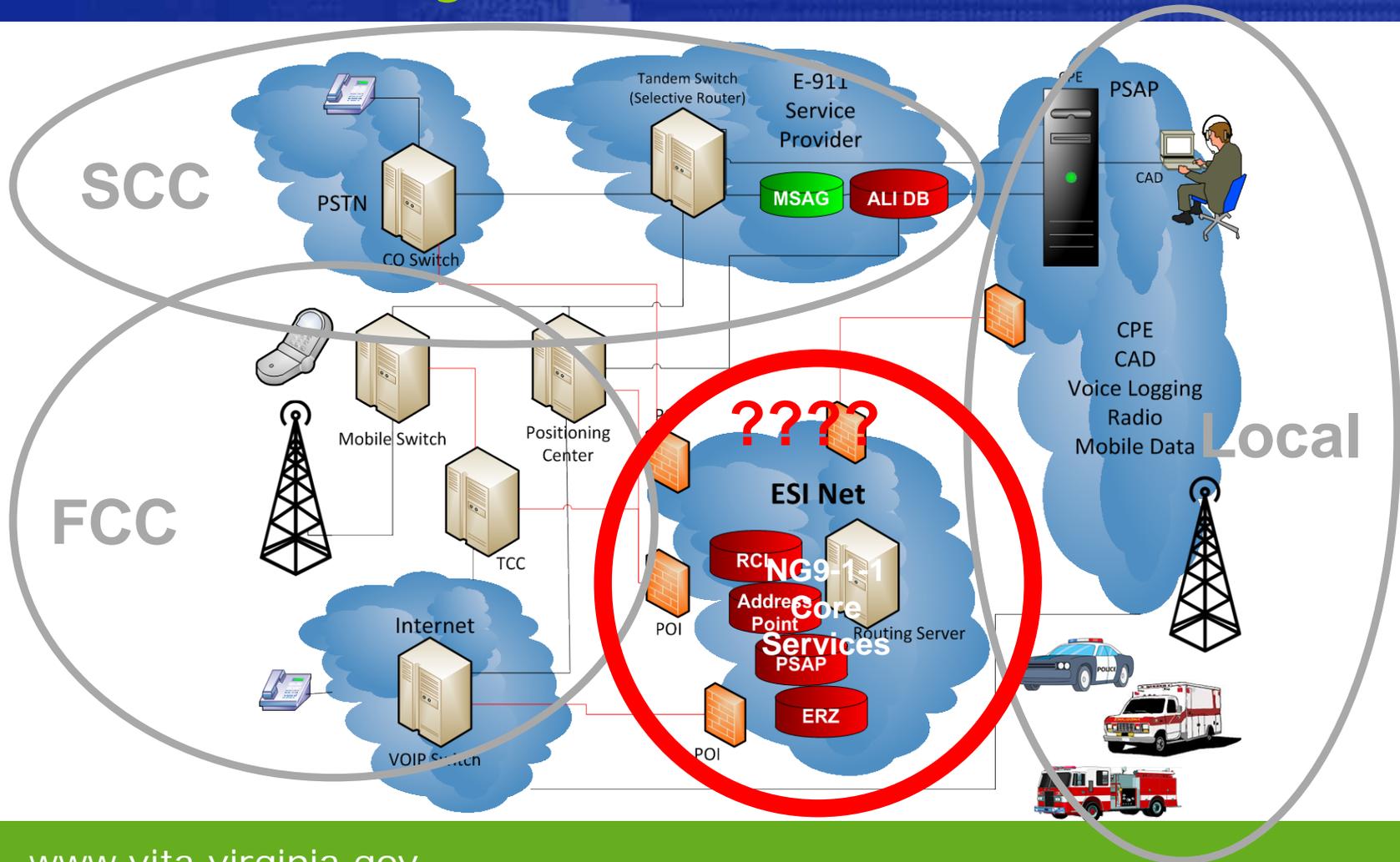

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# ESI Net Options

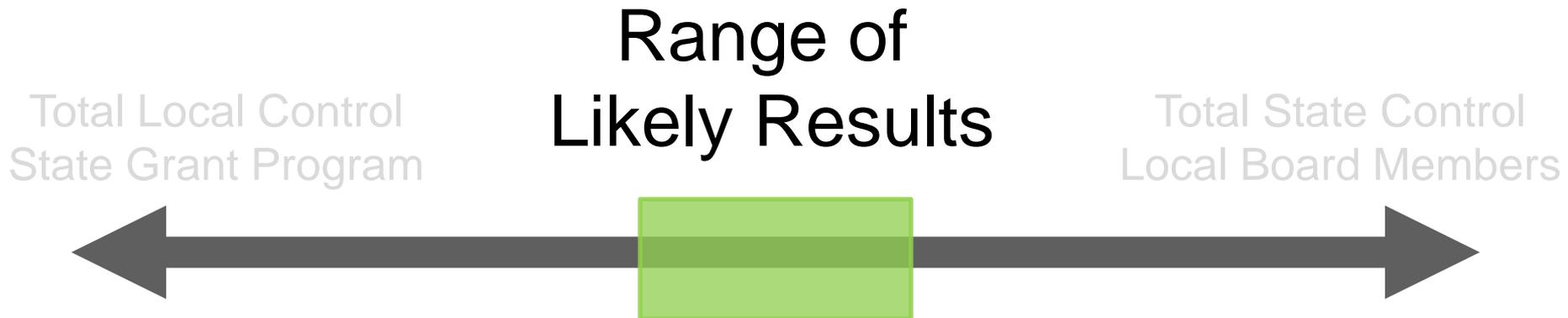
Total Local Control  
State Grant Program



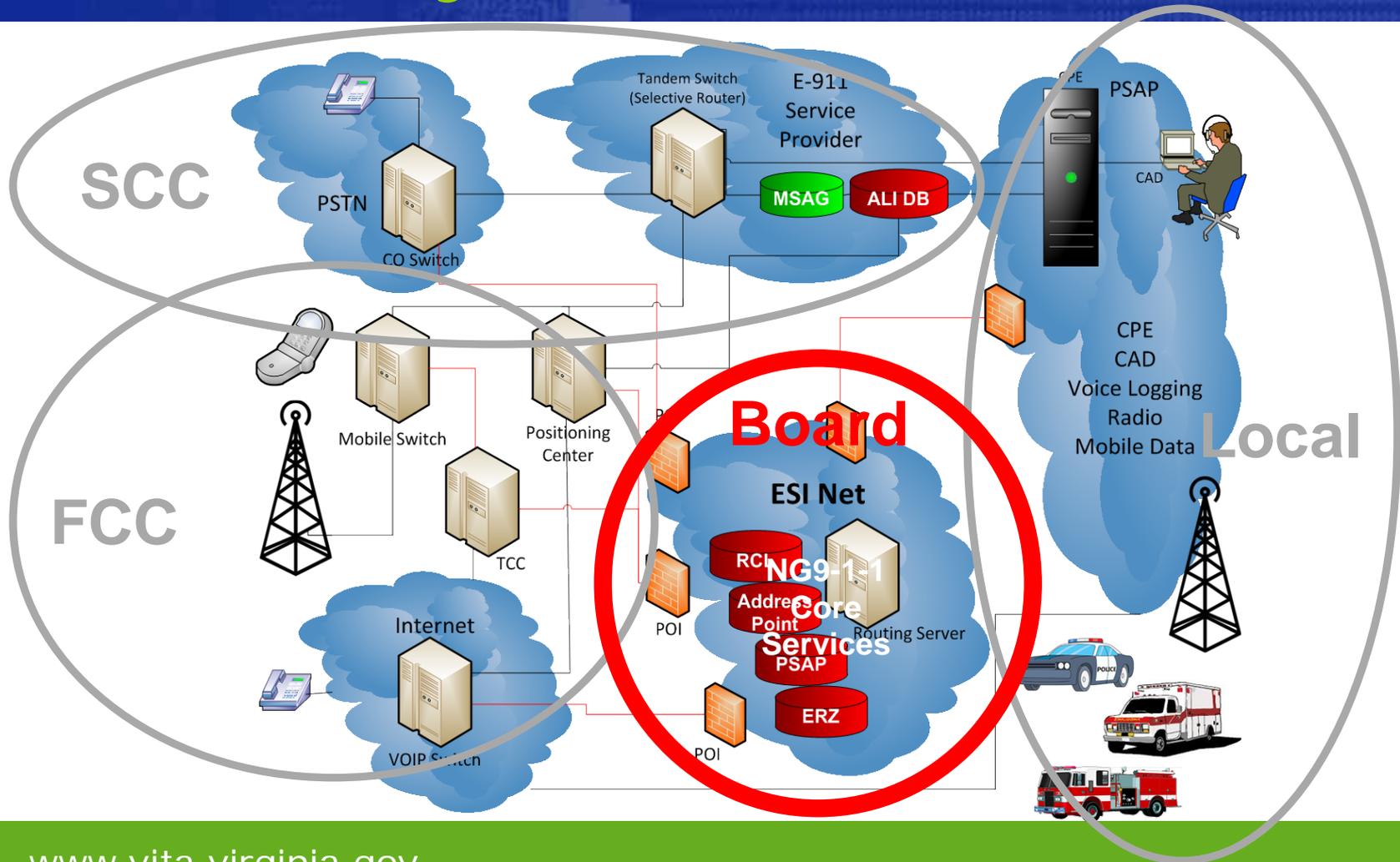
Total State Control

## Role of the Board

- Define Standards for:
  - NG9-1-1 Core Services
  - ESI Net
  - PSAP Function
  - Processing of information through the ESI Net
  - Ensuring the Commonwealth can operate as a single network and interoperate with other states
- Assist localities with best practices for those things in Local control

## Other Roles Being Discussed

- Collaborate with SCC and others
- Enter into contracts
- Ensure compliance with relevant legislation and regulations
- Entity responsible for NG9-1-1 service provider certification/rulemaking authority
- Technical assistance
- Relationship with greater public safety and homeland security agencies
- I3 Standard



# Role of the Advisory Council





## Advisory Council

- Proposed in NG9-1-1 Feasibility Study
  - One member elected from each of 7 regions
  - Provide advice to the Board
- Board action March 12<sup>th</sup> to direct Policy Committee to address at their 1<sup>st</sup> meeting
- Policy Committee discussed March 26<sup>th</sup> asked ISP Staff to discuss with PSAPs
- PSAP work session and APCO/NENA Board meetings April 22<sup>nd</sup>
- APCO/NENA letter provides results



## Feedback on Advisory Council

- Recommend a regional approach:
  - Geographically dispersed
  - Include an alternate
  - Letter of support from locality
- Council should support PSC Coordinator
- Flexibility in meeting requirements is desired
- Provide advice and recommendations on the thematic areas identified in the Study
- Increase awareness and support of outreach efforts regarding the entire 9-1-1 ecosystem



## Policy Committee Recommendation

- Concurs with the Recommendations on the role of the Board in 9-1-1 Ecosystem
- Concurs with codifying 9-1-1 as essential, local, public safety service
- Move forward with legislation but address concern about not resolving funding issue
- Supports agreement for creation of Regional Advisory Council (RAC) as support to PSC Coordinator as proposed
- RAC to have standing meeting agenda time

## Project Tasks

- **Task 1: Perform Capabilities Analysis**
  - Develop a picture of Virginia's current 9-1-1 capabilities, challenges, and stakeholder needs
- **Task 2: Develop Statewide 9-1-1 Requirements**
  - Identifies gaps in current capabilities, mapped to technology solutions / user requirements
- **Task 3: Finalize 9-1-1 Comprehensive Plan and Develop Strategic Initiatives**
  - Prioritized list of proposed technology projects
