Statement of Need:

Montgomery County currently utilizes the Dictaphone Freedom recorder. The recorder needs to be replaced due to age and functionality. NICE Systems took over the Dictaphone recorders and no longer offers maintenance or support. Continued maintenance and support will need to be contracted through another vendor or another system purchased. Since the recorder is aging, the County believes a replacement is more advantageous and cost effective.

Comprehensive Project Description:

The goal of this project is to replace aging voice recorder equipment with new equipment offering additional features and more user friendly. The County has acquired budgetary pricing for the recorder and plans to purchase the equipment once the grant is awarded and funds are available. The voice recorder will allow Montgomery County to record and archive all necessary phone lines and radio frequencies.

How will the equipment purchased will support future technologies for PSAP readiness?:

New voice recording equipment will allow the County to possess the latest and newest technology. It will allow the County to record and access all lines and frequencies.

Budget and Budget Narrative:

A detailed budgetary quote has been attached to this application. Once the grant is awarded, the County will follow local procurement rules to purchase the desired system.

Evaluation:

The project will be initiated by selecting the best vendor and equipment to meet the needs of the County. A thorough evaluation of recording features and proper requirements will be planned.
