Statement of Need:

The budgetary liminations of the ESVA 9-1-1 Commission are constraining. This limits the opportunity for

necessary and additional training for staff. Over the last eighteen months all dispatchers have become APCO EMD certified and in early 2009 it is anticipated all staff will become certified in APCO Basic Telecommunicator. This funding would allow using APCO training opportunities to continue moving forward with our training needs.

Comprehensive Project Description:

Funding for this project includes the following training opportunities for staff at the ESVA 9-1-1 Center - 1. APCO EMD concepts (for Operational Medical Director), 2. APCO Fire Service Communications (for all Communications Officers and Supervisors), 3. APCO Telecommunicators Role in Homeland Security (for all Communications Officers and Supervisors), 4. APCO Communications Center Supervisor (for supervisory personnel), 5. APCO webinars - various topics (for various staff)

How will the equipment purchased will support future technologies for PSAP readiness?:

This grant promotes the overall training of staff at the 9-1-1 Center.

Budget and Budget Narrative:

Quote provided by APCO - \$14,503 - This includes the following breakdown - 1. EMD Concepts - \$249 each (1 purchase), 2. Fire Service Communications - \$429 each (20 purchases), 3. Telecommunicators Role in Homeland Security - \$249 each (20 purchases), Communications Center Supervisor - \$399 (1 purchase), and webinars - \$59 each (5 purchases)
