Project Description:

Total Project Cost \$10,000.00

Amount Requested: \$10,000.00

Statement of Need:

The Department just recently added Emergency Fire Dispatch program and have requested funds for the Emergency Police Dispatch program. Currently, the department does not have Fire or Police instructors and have to travel out of town and mostly out of state (NC) to receive this training for certification. With this request the department will be able to instruct these course in house and remain in Virginia and Danville.

Comprehensive Project Description:

With the in house instructors the department will be able to save the funds for traveling, lodging, and meals for future 911 needs. The classes that will be instructed here will be available to any PSAP personnel in VA, saving some funds or time for them that may have to travel out of state or across the state for this training or hold personnel waiting for courses. And if schedule allows these instructors may be able to travel within Va to other locations for PSAP training.

How will the equipment purchased will support future technologies for PSAP readiness?:

Being allowed to release 911 personnel sooner that are on probation waiting for training schedules from other jurisdictions. Having instructors in house can get more and better trained 911 telecommunicators to the center and callers sooner than now.

Budget and Budget Narrative:

The Department is requesting 2 staff members receive Fire instructors training and 1 receive Police

instructor training at 3,750 each for a total of 11,250. This includes training, materials, and travel. The Department will be able to provide the remaining 1,250 (if all request are granted) from the savings by in house training in our general budget that this request will provide in during the budget year.
