Hosted Mail Archiving

- Hosted Mail Archiving (HMA) is new service that will allow agencies the capability to archive email (sent and received) as defined in their retention requirements. HMA also provides the capability for legal holds and e-Discovery of email
- HMA will utilize the Symantec Enterprise Vault.cloud solution
- Once subscribed to the new service, all email will be captured automatically in the users' archive

Hosted Mail Archiving

- Access the personal archive via a Web-based portal
- Specified agency personnel can have the capability to access all users email archive for investigative reasons via the Discovery Portal.
- Via the Web portal, users will authenticate with their COV user ID, but the password will not replicate between COV and Symantec

How to get HMA

- Request HMA using the standard work request form
- When requesting the service, you must include:
 - Required agency retention period
 - Names of users or “entire agency”
 - List of authorized personnel that can review archives (compliance manager)
- Legacy email will not be available automatically
- Ingestion services can be requested via the work request form

Windows 7 Testing Status

- Number of agencies agreed to testing: 59
 - Number of agencies installed: 50
- Number of Windows 7 test PCs deployed: 145
- Number of agencies to start testing:
 - **January:** DGIF
 - **February:** DMAS, DOAV
 - **TBD:** DFS, BTRO, CASC, SMV, VDEM, MVDB, CHR
 - CPFF, VBPD, DDHH (testing as part of DRS)
- Agencies completed: **DMBE, CIT (No issues reported)**

Windows 7 Completion Requirements

- Start and complete Windows 7 testing
 - Phase 1 agencies (July - September) complete January 2012
 - All others complete testing April 2012
- Agencies identify Windows 7 incompatible applications, **including impact statement** (vendor, application, version and number of users)
 - Feb 2012
- Complete Windows 7 signoff sheets and begin deployment
 - April 2012

Windows 7 Application Issues

- **FIPS encryption algorithm:** (DSS) problem with access. Status: **Closed**
- **Microsoft SteadyState software:** (VEC) primarily used on kiosk PCs, does not have a replacement for Windows 7.
 - Status: **McAfee Integrity Control may be an option**
- **Oracle forms and Oracle reports:** (DEQ) not compatible with Windows 7. Status: **Open**
- **QS1 and Labsoft:** (DBHDS) software does not install. Status: **Open**
- **CMS reporting:** (DBHDS) software not 64-bit compatible. Status: **Open**
- **Reflections and IRMA:** (VDA) agency is using versions that appear not to be Windows 7 compliant. Status: **Open**
- **Attachmate:** (DSS) The current version of Attachmate InfoConnect and Attachmate Extra are not compatible with Windows 7.
 - Status: **BlueZone may be an option**
- **32 – 64-bit applications:** Several agencies have expressed concern that 32-bit applications will not function in the 64-bit configuration being tested.
